BRITAIN TO INAUGURATE COMPLETE NETWORK OF AIRLINES

LONDON'S SHOW

The enormous appeal of radio to the public was clearly demonstrated at the annual Radio Exhibition, recently held at Olympia, London when the attendance created a record.

The number of people who visited the show was 225,000 or nearly 63,000 more than last year, while it was officially announced that orders were booked to the value of twenty-six million pounds sterling.

From the point of view of Overseas listeners there was much to be seen of particular interest. Practically all the leading manufacturers of receiving sets are now marketing short-wave receivers specially built for use with the British shortwave transmitting station, which came into operation at the end of last year.

Among the accessories and components to attract the attention of visitors from the Dominions and Colonies was the M.L. Anode Converter, manufactured by Rotax Ltd., a section of the Lucas-C.A.V.-Rotax organization.

MAHATMA'S LOST PRESTIGE

A good many people are inclined to accuse the Indian Government of weakness in liberating Mr. Gandhi, however, they are mistaken.

The Mahatma no longer commands that nation-wide veneration that was his when he set out upon his famous salt march. Should he die in prison, however, there is no saying that he might not become far more troublesome to the authorities as a martyred corpse than he can ever be again as a living fakir.

India has a highly developed sense of humour, though it runs in different channels from our own. That, perhaps, is the reason why it has taken Indians a long time to see the funny side of Mr. Gandhi.

Recently there has been a tendency to smile both at Gandhi's self-ordained fasts and the perturbation which his abstinence from food has cost the Government.

His release recently doubtless caused a laugh, but as he is taking food again it will not be solely against the authorities, and once a holy man becomes a joke he is no longer dangerous to law and order.

SIR FREDERICK SYKES

The late Mr. Bonar Law's son-in-law, Major General Sir Frederick Sykes, has nearly completed his five years as Governor of Bombay.

His term of office has been a most successful one, and he has shown that combination of courage and tact which is the genius of Pro-Consulship abroad.

Incidentally, Sir Frederick remains a consistent supporter of Indian reform. His small boy, whom old R.A.F. comrades nicknamed "Bonzo" after his grandfather despite maternal protests, must now be growing into a sturdy fellow.

Sir Frederick has had, apart from his Indian service, a distinguished career as flying officer and organizer. He is still remembered as a pioneer of aviation, and also as chairman of the Government Committee that gave birth to the B.B.C.

It will be interesting to see what his future destination may be. Probably something in the Pro-Consul line again, for he has no affection for a political life at home.

NEW THING IN EYEGLASSES

My recollection is that it was the War, with its intimate associations that started the horn-rim vogue between England and America.

At any rate the fashion since that time has been, instead of trying to conceal artificial aids to human vision, to emphasize them. The horn-rim has almost ostracized the rimless spectacles.

Now comes word of an ingenious optical device that promises to reverse the popular fashion and make spectacles absolutely invisible. These new glasses are called "contact glasses," and are made to fit close over the eye under the eyelid.

It is claimed for them that they fulfil all the functions of ordinary spectacles, are soon worn without conscious sensation of their presence, and cannot be detected even at short range.

EXPENDITURE OF BRITAIN DECLINE AS REVENUE ARISE

4,500,000 Sterling More Have Been Received By Exchequer

EXPENDITURE IS £27,816,211 LESS

Estate Duties Arisen To Over Four Million Pounds Sterling

LONDON (MS)—The Exchequer, from April 1 to August received in ordinary revenue 222,320,767 Pounds—4,500,000 Sterling more than in the corresponding period of last year.

Expenditure fell 35,000,000 Pounds from 262,816,111 Sterling Pounds.

Favorable items are estate duties more than four millions ahead; stamps up by more than a million.

Customs up four millions; Post Office receipts up three-quarters of a million, and miscellaneous receipts, which show an excess of nearly seven millions.

Income tax is behind by more than four millions; surtax more than a million, and excise more than seven millions.

JAIL SURVIVORS OF STOWAWAY MOVE

Third Smothered On Trip To States; Will Serve 30 Days In Jail

Two survivors of an ill-fated attempt to stowaway on the S. S. Pennsylvania last July that they might enter the United States were yesterday sentenced to serve thirty days in the Balboa jail. The third member of the party, who was smothered to death while hiding out during the attempt, was buried in Potters Field, New York, on the arrival of the Pennsylvania there.

Pedro Spiros, Albanian, and Sotiris Zotos, Greek, were the two survivors who were returned here yesterday by the Pennsylvania, they being removed from the vessel on the Atlantic side.

Spiros, who had a check on his person for one hundred fifty dollars when sentenced, told of how he had paid a member of the Pennsylvania's crew fifty dollars to see that they were well hidden aboard and supplied with food. They boarded the vessel at ten o'clock at night, and were secluded in a vent leading from the engine room.

Lack of air was evident from the time they entered the shaft, the men said. Slowly their companion weakened and when his condition rapidly became worse they surrendered themselves to the ship's officers. He might have a chance for his life. He was dead when removed from the vent.

Suggest Commissioner For the Jewish Relief

GENEVA, Oct. 6 (AP)—The Sub-Committee of the Economic Commission of the League suggested the appointment of a High Commissioner to administer the Jewish relief as a solution for the refugee problem.

North Americans close to the League called the Jewish relief workers in New York to ascertain whether Theodore Roosevelt Jr., ex-Governor of Puerto Rico and the Philippines, will be available for the post.

Machete Killer Flees To Mountains After Brutal Murder

DAVID, Oct. 6.—The police are scouring the Volcan region in an effort to capture Gregorio Lezcano, who murdered his wife and then fled into the mountains. Witnesses told the police that the brutal murder was the outcome of an argument over a trivial matter. During the discussion Lezcano became enraged, armed himself with his machete and lunged at the woman.

The first time he swung, Lezcano almost beheaded his victim but not satisfied with the results of this first mortal wound inflicted on the defenceless woman, he swung again and again and every time effectively.

The woman died instantly. Posses have been sent out on down the murderer.

THAT BODY OF YOURS

By JAS. W. BARTON, M.D. What Is Mental Health?

As a youngster I lived directly opposite the gate of a large mental hospital, "the asylum" we called it.

I played with other youngsters in the hospital grounds which were surrounded by a high brick wall. We saw very few patients, because they were nearly all kept behind locked doors, a few only being allowed around the grounds.

Having any mental illness in those days meant that by some unnatural or supernatural means these inmates had "gone out of their minds" and therefore nothing could be done about it, except to lock them up.

Some idea of the change that has come over the method of treating mental illness is shown by the records of one mental hospital of 1900, of whom only 200 are kept behind locked doors, and 1,200 are not keenly interested in some form of work. These two patients are very ill and require rest in bed.

The patients in the unlocked section come and go about their various duties, some washing, some ironing, mending, sewing, lace-making, belt-making, knitting, basketry and other forms of work. Outside there is a large farm, and dairy work.

What has brought about this great improvement in the treatment of mental cases, since my boyhood days?

SURVEY OF SHIPS FOR SEAWORTHINESS REVOLUTIONISED AT OLYMPIA EXHIBIT

Demonstration Enables Thickness of Steel Plates To Be Accurately And Quickly Measured, Which Result In Important Savings

LONDON (MS)—A new invention which revolutionises the surveying of ships for seaworthiness, was demonstrated for the first time at the Shipping Exhibition at Olympia, London.

It enables the thickness of steel plates to be accurately and quickly measured when access is available to one side of the plate only—a result which it is anticipated will result in important savings both of time and money.

At present the accepted method involves the drilling of a hole through the plate, a measurement with a gauge through the hole made, and making water tight the hole if below water level.

Ships on an average are surveyed in this way about once every four years, and a single survey may involve the drilling of several hundred holes, not only in the bottom plates but in deck plates, the inner-bottom and bulkheads.

The invention is the result of many years' research by the Scientific Instrument Makers' Research Association, London, with the support of the Department of Scientific and Industrial Research.

The method depends on the flow of magnetic forces in the steel plate, which a representative of the "Morning Post" was assured, affords a test of quite sufficient accuracy and reliability for the purpose.

ACQUIT ALCALDE OF INTERIOR TOWN

Mayor Was Accused By Man Imprisoned For Contempt

The acquittal of Justino Lopez G., Alcalde of the District of Guarare, in the Province of Los Santos, was confirmed yesterday by the Supreme Court which upheld the decision of the Judge of the second circuit court of that Province who held that the charges of attempting against personal liberty, proffered against the Alcalde, had not been proven.

The charges against Alcalde Lopez G., were proffered by Gerardo Diaz, a resident of Guarare who refused to obey the summons of a Corregidor. The latter official complained to the Alcalde who fined Diaz and when he refused to pay his fine, ordered his imprisonment.

The courts ruled that the Alcalde's procedure had been entirely legal and that he complied with his duties, as required by law, when he took action against Diaz for his refusal to obey the summons of the Corregidor.

In another decision announced yesterday by the Supreme Court, Benigna Bernal de Veces, a Panamanian woman, has been indicted on the charge of assault and battery. The charges against the woman had been dismissed by the judge of the fourth circuit court, who considered that the accused had acted in self-defense when he injured her opponent, C. Estrada, but the Supreme Court disagreed and indicted Benigna, who will therefore go on trial.

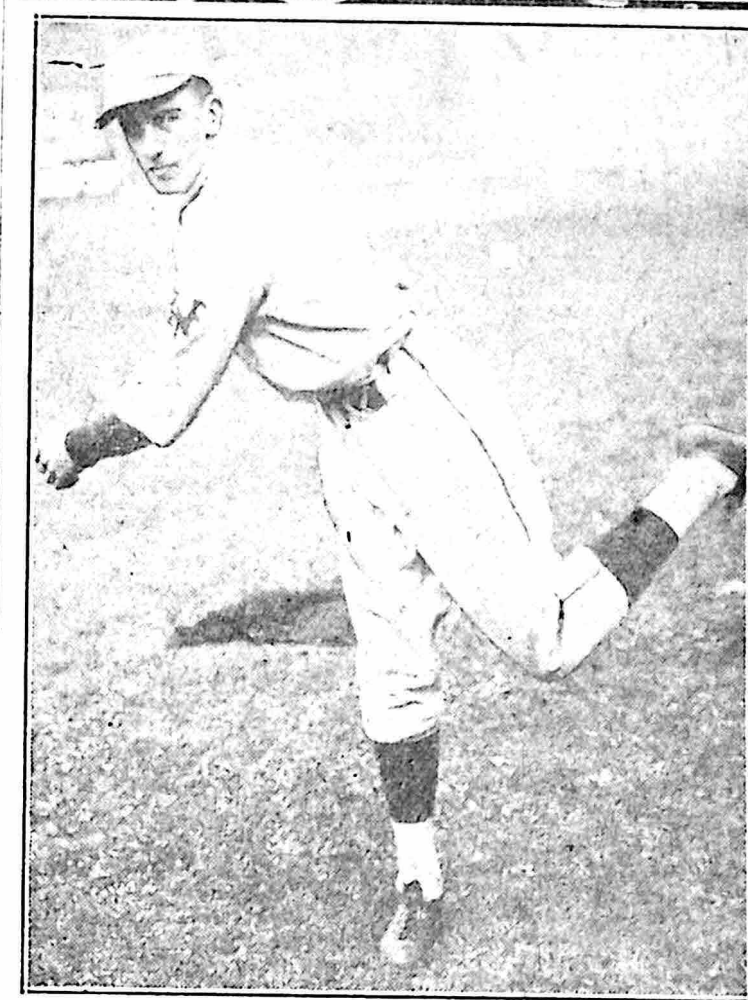
